

# New Zealand Short Term Training Scholarships

## Online Trade Policy

### Overview

The New Zealand Government's Manaaki New Zealand Scholarships Programme is pleased to offer new Professional Cohort Courses supported by New Zealand International Development Cooperation. These are intensive short courses designed for participants from Africa, ASEAN and Timor-Leste, Latin America and the Caribbean, and the Pacific, with at least 5 years work experience in each of the course sectors.

The courses are:

- Good Governance
- Trade Policy
- Public Sector Leadership
- Public Health Management

Each online course is run over a four week period, consisting of two three hour sessions per week. The in person courses run from 10-4pm over two weeks. Both the online and in-person courses that will be run by the University of Auckland's Public Policy Institute. The expectation would be that scholars are available to complete the entire learning programme over the four weeks online or the two weeks in person.

The online training will allow for part-time learning, while ensuring continued scholar engagement. The in-person block will be more intensive. courses have been scheduled so as to allow an individual to enrol and participate in more than one course. The courses do not constitute a formal tertiary qualification, but will provide scholars with unique insights into New Zealand approaches and best practice in each sectoral study area. On completion each scholar will be awarded a completion certificate from the Manaaki New Zealand Scholarships Programme.

<b>Good Governance</b>	Adaptive and e-governance; combatting corruption; rule of law; inclusive and Indigenous participation; gender mainstreaming; climate and sustainable development
<b>Trade Policy</b>	Trade reforms; supply chains and digital trade; regional, bi and multi-lateral agreements; Indigenous and sustainable trade; Labour migration and Inclusive trade; Future trends
<b>Public Sector Leadership</b>	Strategic and crisis leadership, risk management, ethics and integrity, building capability, Indigenous and inclusive leadership, co-producing outcomes
<b>Public Health Management</b>	Health Leadership, Public Health Systems, Measures, evaluation and equity, leadership and communication; local health design and delivery

## When?

Online Trade Policy for participants from Africa will start on **16 October 2023**. Participants will need to be available and have suitable internet to access their online training course, and any subsequent meetings related to the course.

These courses are suitable for officials with at least 5 years work experience in the relevant course sector. Applicants can apply for more than one course.

## Key Learning Outcomes

### Trade

- Ability to identify the key intersections between international economic policy and health and environmental policy, and critically assess policy coherence (or identify incoherence)
- Critically appraise challenges and opportunities associated with complex geo-political and economic factors and their impacts on trade relationships
- Ability to identify the key stakeholders - both within and outside the economic sector - that are impacted by trade policy, as well as their respective interests and priorities, including Indigenous economies and trade
- Understand and balance the connections between the public health and environmental objectives when conducting regulatory impact assessments and future directions in trade
